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| Story <br> Write a story using your vocabulary words. The meanings of the vocabulary words must be evident through the use of context clues. Make sure the correct choice is not noted. <br> Example: If you want to see something exquisite, would you go to a museum or a gas station? (Try to use at least two vocabulary words in each analogy) Example: <br> Hot :cold :: on :off | CREATE riddle for each of your spelling word. Give Three clues and a What am I question? Example: <br> I am happy all the time. <br> I like to make people smile. <br> I enjoy being around a crowd. <br> What am I? <br> (jovial) | RESEARCH <br> Conduct a research on your vocabulary words.
